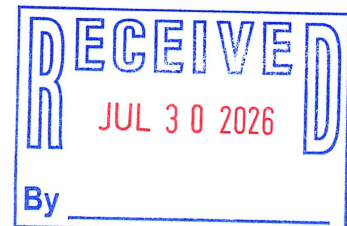

*** Utah Code §20A-2-101.5 states: A person convicted of a felony loses the right to hold office until (1) all felony convictions have been expunged, OR (2) ten years have passed since the most recent felony conviction AND the person has paid all court-ordered restitution and fines AND the person has completed probation, been granted parole, or completed the term of incarceration associated with the felony.*

As a civically engaged resident, I understand the importance of working as a team and keeping the residents and city's priorities in mind while working towards improving outcomes that can benefit all within the city.

I consider myself a civically engaged citizen who is team oriented and solution driven, and want to ensure voices are heard and those in leadership roles are advocating for the best interests of the people they represent. I have direct city, policy and budget experiences that can assist with the duties required of a city council member. As a resident of White City since 2020, I have volunteered with several events through the White City Community Council (Last Bash of Summer, Car Parade & Park and Plant Swaps), I am on the Give Back White City Subcommittee, moderate the White City Neighbors Facebook Page, assisted with the installation and hosting of events for the Buddlea Bend Little Free Library, and provide Welcome to the Neighborhood treats and informational sheets to new nearby neighbors to assist with community involvement, awareness and building relations.

As president of the Macro Social Work Student Network at Arizona State University, I sent policy briefs to representatives, organized call-to-actions, presented at Arizona's Social Work Day at the Legislature, and further promoted conversations and the participation of political and macro related topics or activities. With the City of Phoenix Housing Department, I assisted with authoring grants and worked with budgets for community resource events targeting families in public housing and individuals in the surrounding community. I have developed and revived programs with performing tasks such as creating policies and procedures, forms, objectives, goals, evaluation measures, and recruiting members. As a Community Engaged Scholar through the University of Utah, I raised donations for the preschool at The Road Home, developed lesson plans and volunteered with a variety of agencies. As a Representative for the Associated Students of The University of Utah (ASUU), I wrote or co-sponsor bills, used parliamentary procedures to debate presented bills, amendments or resolutions and was on the Student Fee Committee. With these leadership roles, I have been a part of several meetings with community partners, organizations, residents and stakeholders and recognize the importance of maintaining positive relationships.

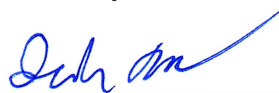
